Dear Friends in Christ,

This year, House of Mercy has already served more than 75,000 neighbors with free food, clothing, and essentials. Poverty is complicated. While we can discuss general trends—such as the struggles of people with medical issues, low income, or other socioeconomic challenges—the truth is, everyone has a unique story, just like you and me.

Recently, a social worker called about John, who had just been released from jail. When our Program Manager Erin spoke with him, John shared that he was homeless, had not eaten in over 24 hours, and wondered if we had food that did not require refrigeration or cooking. After learning it would take John two hours to walk to us, we made a decision to meet him in Manassas with a temporary food supply and a promise to follow up with more resources.

During our visit, John said that people often judge him without knowing his story, but he is simply trying to move forward. Before we left, he smiled and said, "This is great. I can drop some of this off to my daughter. I always want to be able to provide for her." His words broke my heart. The interaction was a powerful reminder that we cannot grasp the magnitude of our neighbors' struggles—or how to truly help—until we open our hearts to them.

This is why House of Mercy exists. With a mission of Mercy, we are able to be relational, to serve the real needs of the individual, and to purposefully be flexible when someone is in desperate need with no where else to turn. We serve not only physical needs but also walk alongside individuals in their most vulnerable moments

We all know the story of The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:29-37). When Jesus asked, "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" The man replied, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus then said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Your support is what allows us to be good neighbors and treat everyone with mercy, as Jesus instructs us to do. Only with your generosity are we able to help people like John, who is trying to start his life over, and others who can no longer support their family.
